

## THE PAPAL CANONIZATIONS

**T**here has been much speculation about the reasons behind the canonisation of two recent Popes, John XXIII and John Paul II. For some, it is the bringing together of two factions, the liberal and the conservative wings, in an attempt to unite the Church. As thoughtful commentators point out, such labels do not do justice to complex characters: Pope John XXIII, sometimes held up as a hero of the liberal Church, was imbued with a deeply traditional Italian piety, while Pope John Paul II, seen as a firm traditionalist, was radical in opposition to the Death Penalty and the War in Iraq.

Yet more important than any perceived politics behind the joint canonization is the simple lesson that today's ceremony shows that there are different ways to holiness. Both Popes were remarkably different, they followed diverse paths of holiness. John XXIII, in his *Journal of a Soul*, specifically says that he should not seek holiness after some particular model, but "according to the requirements of my own nature, my own character and the different conditions of my life".

Then, it has been noted, this canonization takes us back to the earliest method of declaring saints - by popular acclaim. The enduring cult of John XXIII (you don't have to visit many bars or take many taxis in Italy before you see his image), the chants of *Subito Santo!* at the funeral of John Paul II, remind us that the process of recognizing saints in the Church begins in the devotion of ordinary faithful.

Finally, it tells us a good deal about holiness. There are those who have criticised some of the actions of both Popes, saying (for example) that the calling of Vatican II by John XXIII weakened the Church, or that some of the policies of Pope John Paul II undermined the spirit of the Council. Canonization is not a declaration that everything that they did was perfect. It is not an assumption that none of their policies was mistaken. Saints are those who, despite their human weakness and their mistakes, strive to live a life of holiness. Any frailty in these great Pontiffs, far from detracting from their holiness, actually increases it, as it demonstrates their heroic determination to follow Christ.
