Catholic Parliamentary Internships

Now in its seventh year, the scheme provides seven recently graduated Catholics with an intensive experience of political and social action in a spiritual context. Interns are placed either with Christian MPs, or work at Archbishop's House, Westminster, or work with Christian MEPs in Brussels - good working knowledge of French is required for this latter posting. Interns are selected on the basis of ability and potential to gain most benefit from the experience. Financial support is provided and living, accommodation and travel costs all found. All internships will run from September 2010 to July 2011. Fisher House has previously supplied three interns. All applicants must be UK citizens. See notice in library.
