MYSTERY

Mystery is the atmosphere in which all must be seen. Seeing reality can be an exhilarating experience; *really* seeing it includes seeing why we cannot see more of it. To put it in one phrase: we cannot know God as he knows himself and we cannot know one another or even ourselves as well as our Creator knows them and us. Yet the light into which we can grow is life-giving. We should be constantly aware that mystery is inescapable: mystery in the form of truths we cannot yet see how to reconcile with one another; mystery in the even harder form of happenings we cannot see how to reconcile with God's goodness. If we know *why* we cannot see, the darkness is a kind of light, and we need not be annoyed at not being omniscient. Christ knows every situation better than we do, and has infinitely more love in him than we have.
