omorrow, in Rome, there commences the Synod on the family. Expectations are high, perhaps unrealistically so, that there will be some accommodation made so that those who are in second marriages (with their first partners still alive) might be admitted to Holy Communion. As you know, those who are divorced and remarried are not permitted to take the Sacrament.

News reports have swirled around the possibility of change in the new era of Pope Francis; it is pointed out that this is an issue affecting a growing number of families, and that a generation of children is growing up that has never seen their parents received Holy Communion. To this is objected the fact that few moral teachings carry such authority as the prohibition on divorce: it is our Lord himself who forbids it. The opposing arguments have become personalised around the considerable figures of Cardinal Kasper, the noted German theologian whom Pope Francis quoted at his first audience, and Cardinal Burke, the American Canon Lawyer and head of the Vatican department that deals with marriage nullity.

What seems to be in play is not a suggestion that the theology of marriage could change, or even that divorce might be seen as an acceptable option - Church teaching on the sanctity of the marriage bond is unassailable - but rather the pastoral approach might be adopted to the situation of a marriage breakdown.

However, it will be sad if the Synod is reduced to a single issue, however pressing. The bishops and theologians from around the world will seek to sustain and strengthen the institution which is at the heart of our civilization, which is the measure of its health, and which is so comprehensively under attack. Pope Francis said last week, "Happy families are essential for the Church and for society". Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the Synod fathers (and mothers!), so that the Synod may truly be an inspiring and instructive moment in the life of the Church
