ADVENT PREPARING TO CELEBRATE CHRISTMAS

Our days are filled. We are hurtling to the end of term. There is much to do and enjoy. And for most, Christmas Day is the climax of the festive season. From now, until 25 December, there are gifts to be bought, parties to be enjoyed, crackers to be pulled. Yet we know that Christmas Day is only the beginning of the festive season, with Advent its mini Lent. I shall not suggest that we remain aloof from the Christmas festivities already in full swing. But we should not let the opportunity of Advent be drowned in mulled wine. How to keep it though? Consider these possibilities:

- 1. Going to Mass during the week.
- 2. Giving (extra) time to prayer 10 mins.
- 3. Pray a decade each day from the Joyful Mysteries.
- 3. Read scripture or a spiritual reading book.
- 4. Support a Charity.
- 5. Abstain from something food/drink.

Too often we arrive at Christmas Day bloated and tired. Once again we have allowed ourselves to be robbed of the opportunity of Advent. This year, however, we could go deeper, and be ready at Christmas to welcome Jesus because - through December - we created a crib for Him in our hearts.
