**A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF CUCA,
PROFESSOR EAMON DUFFY**

**APPOINTMENT OF A NEW CATHOLIC CHAPLAIN TO THE UNIVERSITY OF
CAMBRIDGE**

The Chairman, Bishop John Arnold, and members of the Oxford and Cambridge Catholic Education Board are delighted to announce the appointment of **Monsignor Mark Langham, MA STL**, as senior chaplain at Fisher House, in succession to Father Alban McCoy, who completes fifteen years of outstanding service to the Catholic community and the wider University in September 2013.

A native of London, Mark Langham read Classics at Magdalene, before training for the Priesthood at the Venerable English College, Rome. Ordained for the Diocese of Westminster in 1990, he was assigned to Westminster Cathedral where he served successively as Precentor and Sub-Administrator. From 1996 Mark was parish priest of St Mary of the Angels, a busy community in Bayswater, west London. In 2001 he returned to Westminster Cathedral as Administrator, and was created Monsignor in 2003. Under his Administration the chapels of St Thomas of Canterbury and St Joseph were decorated with mosaics, and the Western entrance underwent major redevelopment.

During his time at Westminster Cathedral one of his priorities was the development of ecumenical relations, and he collaborated closely with his nearby colleagues at Westminster Abbey and Methodist Central Hall. In 2006 Monsignor Langham was appointed an honorary Canon of St Paul's Cathedral, London, and in 2008 a member of the College of Westminster Abbey. In 2010 he provided BBC radio and television commentary for the visit of Pope Benedict XVI to Great Britain.

In 2008 Mark was asked by Cardinal Cormac Murphy-O'Connor to work at the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity, in Rome, where he has been responsible for co-ordinating the Anglican and Methodist dialogues, and for maintaining relations between the Vatican and the worldwide Anglican Communion and the World Methodist Council. He is also a member of the International Committee which produces material for the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

We are delighted to have secured the services of so distinguished a successor to Father Alban, and look forward greatly to welcoming and supporting Monsignor Langham in his ministry among us.

It is a great pleasure to be able to say that Father Alban himself will not be lost to Cambridge once he steps down at Fisher House. He is expected to join St Edmund's College as Dean from September 2013. Meanwhile, there will be opportunities in the coming term for us to express our gratitude for all Father Alban has given to us in his time at Fisher House. And in the meantime, we thank him very warmly, and we wish him every happiness and success in the future.
