ENCOUNTERING CHRIST IN JOY

arly in his papacy, Pope Francis addressed the entire Church by way of an exhortation he called *The Joy of the Gospel*. There, he raises two themes of life which have become hallmarks of his papacy. First, regularly experiencing joy is crucial to human life well lived. Secondly, this joy is characterized by the Christian Gospel—good news of God—which is itself a *source* of our joy in this life.

But to understand how this hope of joyfulness may be realized for us, the pope explains that the crucial link between our daily living and regular joyfulness is encounter with Jesus. So pressing, for him, is such joy that Francis puts to us a very direct request: 'I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting him encounter them. No one should think that this invitation is not meant for him or her'.

With the simple words 'openness' and 'encounter', the Holy Father describes for us the way that St Ignatius Loyola understands how we meet God in the ordinariness of everyday life. Always, the initiative is the Lord's. But what we need to do is to open ourselves to the possibility that Jesus will personally encounter us, which can only happen if we decide to make ourselves available. If we decide, in both mind and heart, to look for the Lord- in our lives.

This is the origin of the oft-quoted and loosely-used Jesuit line, 'finding God in all things'. More accurately, this saying describes the process of examination of conscience, during which one reviews the events of life, and asks the Lord to show us his traces in our day. Here, the key ingredient is what Ignatius calls the *discreta caritas*, or discerning love. It is in the experience of looking for love that we detect the very personal presence of Christ in our lives. Moreover, that experience leads us to decide in a quite deliberate and concrete way to turn ourselves to the Lord, and to open our hearts in responding to that love.

It is in this fundamental disposition of openness towards the Lord that we encounter Christ. The fruit of that loving exchange is a deep and profound joy—joy from being loved, and from encounter with the One who is all Truth. This, then, is the heart of what Pope Francis is driving at in *The Joy of the Gospel*, and why he encourages us so strongly take on that disposition of openness to personal relationship with Christ that brings so much joy.
